The Town of Delmar, Delaware was scheduled to hold its' Municipal Election on Monday, October 1, 2018. Because no one challenged the incumbents, an election was not necessary. On Monday, November 5, 2018, the Delaware Mayor and Council held its' Oath of Office ceremonies for Mayor Michael Houlihan, Council Member Mary Lee Pase, and Council Member Gregory Smith. After the ceremony, Council Member Pase was appointed to serve as the Vice Mayor.



Mayor Houlihan's new term will expire in 2020 and the terms for both Vice Mayor Pase and Council Member Smith will expire in 2022.



Also recognized on Monday, November 5, 2018, at the Delmar, Delaware Mayor and Council meeting was Jane Ann Smith for her 50 years of volunteering with the Ladies Auxiliary for the Delmar Volunteer Fire Department. Delmar Utility Customers:

We are happy to announce that we can provide a new mailing option for your quarterly billing. We can email your quarterly bill directly to your email.

The setup is quite simple! Email us at delmartownhall@verizon.net from the email address that you wish to receive your quarterly bill and provide a brief message that you wish to begin the new E-Bill option. That is, it! We will attach the email address to your utility account. We will send out a "test" email to ensure proper delivery will occur prior to the new billing quarter.

Prevent Winter Water Leaks

Winter weather is certainly here and along with the winter weather comes the risk of frozen pipes. In order to avoid frozen pipes, allow a trickle of water to run through them and if the pipes are concealed by cabinets, open the cabinet doors to allow heat to get to them. If a pipe does indeed freeze and burst, contact Town Hall at (410) 896-2777 or (302) 846-2664 as soon as possible to have the water turned off so that repairs may be made. If a pipe bursts after regular business hours, call the Public Works On-Call number (443) 359-0894.

Special Note

Residents with questions concerning their utility bills are encouraged to contact Town Hall upon receipt of the bill and prior to the due date. To help assist process payments as quickly as possible, residents should bring both sections of their bill to Town Hall when making payment.

Reminder

Delinquent utility bills accumulate an *interest* of 1% per month beginning the day after the due date. The due date is listed on all utility bills and is generally one month after the billing date. Other penalties for late payments include a \$10 administrative fee on the seventh day after the due date.

- Disconnection for non-payment can occur as early as sixteen days after the due date. A *\$40 Disconnection fee* is added as of 8 A.M. of day of scheduled disconnection.
- If you are making an online payment please allow 24 hours for payment to be notated on account.
- If bill is not satisfied and disconnected; before water service will be restored the entire amount of the bill and a \$10 reconnection fee must be collected during regular business hours (8 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.).
- Services can be restored **after hours up to 6 p.m. and the reconnection fee is \$30.** Payment must be rendered to Town Hall by 9 a.m. the following business morning or the evening of restoration. Payments can be deposited in our drop box located behind Town Hall.

DID YOU KNOW???

Delmar's first school was a one room building erected about 1865 at the corner of First and Grove Streets on land donated by Winder Hastings. It was a one room building furnished with long benches and desks made of planks. The building was used at various times for religious services. Adult education classes were held in the schoolhouse on Sunday afternoons during the 1870's. This building remained until 1885 when it was burned and a two-story building was erected in its' place. When the school reopened there were 65 students who were graded into 2 departments.

In the corner of the woods near the junction of Rt. 13A and Foskey Lane, 2 one room buildings served from 1870-1890 as the school-houses for the students on the Maryland side of Town. One of these buildings was for the smaller children and the other for older boys and girls. The building for the older students was used only during the winter months when it was impossible for the children to do farm work. It was closed during the fall and spring.

In 1889 a two room building was erected closer to Town. This school was much superior to the first and served the community for 6 years. In 1895 it was necessary for the students of the highest grade to attend school in the old M.P. Church west of the railroad. During the first two decades of the 20th century, 2 wooden two-story structures, one located at First and Grove Streets and the other at Rt. 13A and Chestnut Streets served the educational needs of the Town. In 1919 a small brick high school was built near Foskey Lane on Second Street. From 1921 to 1937 elementary school children continued to attend the school on Chestnut Street. In 1937, the Board of Education for Wicomico County, Maryland, with the assistance of a P.W.A. Grant added enough classrooms to the high school building to accommodate the elementary school children. Shortly thereafter, the old wooden structure was demolished.

In 1928, with the completion of a large, modern school building at the eastern side of Jewel Street, the elementary and high school children of the Delaware side of Town vacated the building they had occupied for so many years and moved into the new building.

After a concerted effort by all of the citizens of Delmar, the two high schools of the Town were consolidated in 1949. From this date on, all students receiving a high school education in Delmar have attended the Delmar, Delaware High School. In 1953, the upper grades of the elementary schools were consolidated with all the children in the 4th, 5th and 6th grades attending the Delmar, Maryland Elementary school.
