MARYLAND INCUMBENTS GO UNCHALLENGED

The Town of Delmar, Maryland held its General Election on Tuesday, November 19, 2019 from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. at Delmar Town Hall. The voter turnout was extremely low. Out of 1987 registered voters only 28 voted. There were no challengers and the incumbents ran unopposed. There were no write in candidates. On Monday, December 9, 2019 at 8:00 p.m., the Maryland Mayor and Commissioners will hold its Oath of Office ceremonies for Mayor Karen Wells, Commissioner Lloyd Unsell and Commissioner Jack Lenox. Everyone is welcome to attend.

Mayor Wells' new term will expire in 2021 and the terms for both Commissioners Scholl and Lenox will expire in 2023.

THE 2020 CENSUS

A Decennial Census is conducted every 10 years by the U.S. Census Bureau. It is a count of everyone residing in the United States on the census date of April 1st. April 1, 2020, every home will receive an invitation to participate in the 2020 Census. Getting a complete and accurate census count is critically important. The results are critically important because this once-a-decade census data helps businesses, researchers, and communities make decisions. The data can help inform where your community needs a new fire department, more funding for school lunches, or new roads. The results are further used to determine how much funding local communities receive for key public services/programs/grants and how many seats each state gets in Congress. State and local officials also use census counts to draw boundaries for congressional, state legislative, and school districts. That's why your response is required by law, if you do not respond, the U.S. Census Bureau will follow up in person to collect your response. While you are required by law to participate, the Census Bureau is also required by law to protect your answers. Your responses are used only to produce statistics. The Census Bureau does not disclose any personal information.

As required by the Census Act, the U.S. Census Bureau submitted a list of questions to Congress on March 29, 2018. Based on those questions, the 2020 Census will ask:

- **How many people are living or staying at your home on April 1, 2020.** This will help provide a count of the entire U.S. population in order to ensure that a count of people according to where they live on Census Day.
- **Whether the home is owned or rented.** This will help us produce statistics about homeownership and renting. The rates of homeownership serve as one indicator of the nation's economy. They also help in administering housing programs and informing planning decisions.
- **About the sex of each person in your home.** This allows us to create statistics about males and females, which can be used in planning and funding government programs.

This data can also be used to enforce laws, regulations, and policies against discrimination.

- **About the age of each person in your home.** The U.S. Census Bureau creates statistics to better understand the size and characteristics of different age groups. Agencies use this data to plan and fund government programs that support specific age groups, including children and older adults.
- **About the race of each person in your home.** This allows us to create statistics about race and to provide other statistics by racial groups. This data helps federal agencies monitor compliance with anti-discrimination provisions, such as those in the Voting Rights Act and the Civil Rights Act.
- **About whether a person in your home is of Hispanic, Latino, or Spanish origin.** These responses help create statistics about this ethnic group. This is needed by federal agencies to monitor compliance with anti-discrimination provisions, such as those in the Voting Rights Act and the Civil Rights Act.
- **About the relationship of each person in your home.** This allows the Census Bureau to create estimates about families, households, and other groups. Relationship data is used in planning and funding government programs that support families, including people raising children alone.

Governments, businesses, communities, and nonprofits all rely on the data that these questions produce to make critical decisions.

The Census Bureau will ***never*** ask you for:

- Your Social Security number.
- Money or donations.
- Anything on behalf of a political party.
- Your bank or credit card account numbers.

If someone claiming to be from the Census Bureau contacts you via email or phone and asks you for one of these things, it's a scam, and you should not cooperate.

THE 2020 CENSUS QUESTIONNAIRE WILL NOT ASK FOR CITIZENSHIP STATUS!!!

Once the invitation arrives, you should respond for your home in one of three ways: online, by phone, or by mail. When completing the census, you will include everyone living in your home on April 1st. People in some special living situations may have questions about how to respond. This includes:

- Students.
- Service members.
- People in correctional facilities.
- People who move on Census Day (April 1, 2020).
- People who do not have fixed addresses.

Why Are Census Workers Out in Communities?

They are verifying addresses in preparation for the census.

They are collecting responses to the census or another survey.

They are dropping off census materials.

They are conducting quality checks related to the census.

If someone visits your home to collect information for the 2020 Census, you can do the following to verify their identity:

First, check to make sure that they have a valid ID badge, with their photograph, a U.S. Department of Commerce watermark, and an expiration date.

If you still have questions about their identity, you can contact your Regional Census Center to speak with a Census Bureau representative.

The Census Bureau needs your help to raise awareness about the 2020 Census and the importance of an accurate count. Join the Town of Delmar and this office, a member of the Salisbury/Wicomico Complete Count Committee to promote the 2020 Census. The 2020 Delaware Census Committee serving Sussex County can be found online as well. Please do your part, encourage your friends and family members to participate in the 2020 Census. An accurate count is critical for all communities across the country. Don't let misinformation keep your friends and family members from responding. One of the best ways you can show your support for the 2020 Census is by making sure you know the facts. Then share these facts with your loved ones. Important Dates

- **April 2020:** Census takers begin visiting college students who live on campus, people living in senior centers, and others who live among large groups of people. Census takers also begin conducting quality check interviews to help ensure an accurate count.
- **May 2020:** The Census Bureau begins visiting homes that haven't responded to the 2020 Census to make sure everyone is counted.
- **December 2020:** The Census Bureau delivers apportionment counts to the President and Congress as required by law.
- **March 31, 2021:** By this date, the Census Bureau will send redistricting counts to states.

Community Revitalization Projects

DELMAR, MARYLAND - SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL PROJECT STATUS UPDATE. Community Development Block Grants

The Office of Community Development, Delmar, Maryland has limited SFY18 CDBG grant funds remaining to assist eligible low-moderate Delmar, MD resident occupant/homeowners in repairing sub-code living conditions. Interested candidates should contact William Hardin, Community Development Coordinator at 410-896-2777 ext. 103 or come to Delmar Town Hall to obtain program eligibility information and receive an application before December 31, 2019. Remaining funds are limited as the SFY18 Program funding round is ending.

The Delmar Office of Community Development is also taking applications for the Delaware SFY 20 CDBG Grant Program for submittal to Sussex County Department of Community Development and Housing (DCDH). DCDH will make an award

announcement by July 2020 if funds are allocated to Sussex County. Interested DE resident occupant/homeowners may inquire and obtain an application at Town Hall or by contacting this office. A waiting list of previous candidates currently exist. Should funds be awarded to DCHD, assistance will be provided to candidates on the waiting list in the order application was received.

In the past few quarters the Delmar Utility Commission has seen many residents having high utility bills due to leaky toilets. Leaky toilets cause hundreds to thousands of gallons of water to go to waste. Consequently, the fix to the toilet will cost significantly less than a high utility bill. Below you will see the five most common causes of a leaking toilet.

5 Most Common Causes of a Leaking Toilet

- Faulty Flapper
- Problems With the Fill Valve
- Refill Tube is Malfunctioning
- The Float Ball
- Worn Gasket



Faulty Flapper - This chain is the component that pulls open the flush valve and allows fresh water into the tank as used water is flushed out. If that chain is either too long or too short, then it may interfere with the ability of the flush valve to properly close.

Fill Valve- This component needs to seal completely after each flush to keep water from leaking. This component can age to the point of malfunction, or it can develop mineral deposits and/or wear down. All of these can prevent it from properly sealing and may require replacement.

Refill Tube - The refill tube of your toilet is the component that replenishes the water within the tank. The top of this tube should always remain above water level. However, if it doesn't, you may hear intermittent running.

Float Ball - This is a small ball that sinks down when the tank empties with a flush, opening up the inlet valve on the fill tube. When the tank is filling, the float ball rises, which closes the valve and stops the filling process. If the float ball is misaligned or malfunctioning in any way, it might not allow the valve to close completely and the water will continue to run.

Worn Gasket – The gasket seal is between the tank and the bowl. If it's worn out, it will allow water to continuously run into your bowl.

We suggest to place a few drops of food coloring in the tank of your toilet and wait a few minutes. If the dyed water in the tank of your toilet shows up in the bowl of your toilet without flushing it, that indicates a flapper seal or flush valve needs to be replaced. Below is a website to assist you if you wish to tackle this issue. If you haven't stopped your toilet from continually running, consider calling a professional plumber to address the problem before you waste any more time and money.

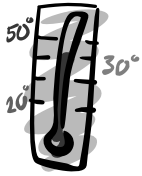

- Milk Jugs, Bleach/Detergent & Shampoo Bottles
- Glass Bottles/Jars (Any Color)
- Metal Cans (tin/steel/aluminum)

Recyclable items are picked up every other Friday.

No more than **(4) receptacles** per household for weekly collection. Please be advised of this for future collection. All bulky items or excessive amounts of debris is required to contact please contact Town Hall for collection assistance.

Be sure to place **ALL** garbage in 35 gallon containers with tight fitting lids. Each container should weigh no more than 50 pounds.

Items such as furniture or appliances can be removed by Public Works for a fee. Please contact Town Hall to receive a quote for disposal of these items.



Prevent Winter Water Leaks

Winter weather is certainly here and along with the winter weather comes the risk of frozen pipes. In order to avoid frozen pipes, allow a trickle of water to run through them and if the pipes are concealed by cabinets, open the cabinet doors to allow heat to get to them. If a pipe does indeed freeze and burst, contact Town Hall at (410) 896-2777 or (302) 846-2664 as soon as possible to have the water turned off so that repairs may be made. If a pipe bursts after regular business hours, call the Public Works On-Call number (443) 359-0894.



Reminder

Residents with questions concerning their utility bills are encouraged to contact Town Hall upon receipt of the bill and prior to the due date. To help assist process payments as quickly as possible, residents should bring both sections of their bill to Town Hall when making payment.

Special Note



Delinquent utility bills accumulate an *interest of 1%* per month beginning the day after the due date. The due date is listed on the all utility bills and is generally one month after the billing date. Other penalties for late payments include a ***\$10 administrative fee*** on the seventh day after the due date.

- Disconnection for non-payment can occur as early as sixteen days after the due date. A ***\$40 Disconnection fee*** is added as of 8 A.M. of day of scheduled disconnection.

- If you are making an online payment please allow 24 hours for payment to be notated on account.
- If bill is not satisfied and disconnected; before water service will be restored the entire amount of the bill and a ***\$10 reconnection fee*** must be collected during regular business hours (8 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.).
- Services can be restored ***after hours up to 6 p.m. and the reconnection fee is \$30.*** Payment must be rendered to Town Hall by 9 a.m. the following business morning or the evening of restoration. Payments can be deposited in our drop box located behind Town Hall.

That is, it!** We will attach the email address to your utility account. We will send out a “test” email to ensure proper delivery will occur prior to the new billing quarter.
