#### Qualifications for Mayor and Commission Member are as follows:

- (a) A resident of the United States and of the State of Maryland and a resident of the Town of Delmar, Maryland for at least two (2) years preceding the municipal elections;
- (b) Be at least 21 years of age
- (c) Each of the qualifications for Town Commissioner and Mayor shall be continuing qualifications to hold office and the failure of any of the Commissioners or the Mayor to have any of the qualifications required by the above during the terms of his/her office will create a vacancy in the office.

Certificates of Candidacy must be completed at the Town Hall by 4:30 p.m. no later than Monday, September 9, 2019. No person shall file for nomination to more than one (1) elective office at a time. All candidates filing to be a Delmar Elected Official must comply with the Town's Ethic Ordinance #724, Section 5(Financial Disclosure)

To be eligible to vote in this upcoming municipal election, persons must be at least 18 years of age, and who has resided in the Town of Delmar, Maryland and the State of Maryland for at least six (6)

months preceding the day of the election and must register at Town Hall. Registration is from Monday through Friday 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. at 100 S. Pennsylvania Avenue, Delmar, MD. Registration deadline is Thursday, September 19, 2019 at 4:30 p.m.

#### NEW PAYMENT OPTIONS AVAILABLE FOR OUR RESIDENTS!!!!!

We are pleased to announce that we are now accepting payments via the web through a secured portal. It will accept credit cards, debit cards, and e-checks. Residents will be able to view the transaction history of their accounts, allow you to view multiple periods of your utility billing information including meter readings and usage and a minimum of three years of tax history. Just go to the Town's website, www.townofdelmar.us and click the payment link...... and follow the instructions to submit your payment to your account. Payments received through this portal will be imported on a daily basis and this will ensure the most updated information available. Below is a listing of items or features that are available to our residents.

- "Lookup only" or "lookup & payment"
- Account lookup by name, by address, or by parcel ID
- Accepts credit cards, debit cards, or e-checks
- Secured payments processed through FIS Global (a PCI compliant company)
- Multiple periods of billing information including meter readings and usage
- Minimum of three years of tax history

#### **Delmar Utility Customers**

We are happy to announce that we can provide a new mailing option for your quarterly billing. We can email your quarterly bill directly to your email.

The setup is quite simple! Email us at delmartownhall@verizon.net from the email address that you wish to receive your quarterly bill and provide a brief message that you wish to begin the new E-Bill option. That is, it! We will attach the email address to your utility account. We will send out a "test" email to ensure proper delivery will occur prior to the new billing quarter.

#### Garbage Collection

Just a reminder to our residents; garbage collection for the Town of Delmar is outsourced. *Allied Waste (Republic Service)* collects garbage for *Delmar, Delaware* on *Tuesday* and *Delmar, Maryland* on *Thursday* unless the normal collection day falls on a legal holiday.

Allied Waste (Republic Service) is responsible for the removal of a reasonable accumulation of household garbage. For bulk collection and the removal of yard waste, contact Town Hall at 410-896-2777 or 302-846-2664.

Garbage is to be placed at *curbside* the *evening prior* to collection *no earlier than sunset*. It is very important that the garbage is placed visibly at the curb outside of any structures, such as fences, that may impair visibility or could lead to an injury during collection. Residents should have no more than four (35) gallon cans per household weighing no more than 50 pounds when filled. Between the days of collection, containers, including any structure designed to store them, shall be located on the back half of the house out of the line of sight from the street upon which the property fronts.

Thank you for your cooperation in helping keep our Town free of debris.

Allied Waste (Republic Service) provides a recycling container for disposal of recyclable items. Please <u>DO NOT</u> place garbage in these containers. The following items <u>ARE</u> accepted by DSWA for recycling:

- Magazines/Catalogs
- Telephone/Soft Cover Books
- Junk Mail/Envelopes (All Types)
- Office Paper
- Paperboard (cereal/tissue boxes) & Beverage Holders
- Corrugated Cardboard
- Narrow-Neck Plastic Bottles
- Milk Jugs, Bleach/Detergent & Shampoo Bottles
- Glass Bottles/Jars (Any Color)
- Metal Cans (tin/steel/aluminum)

Recyclable items are picked up every other Friday.

### **Driving Safety Refresher: Back to School**

Autumn is almost upon us and schools across the county will soon be back in full swing. Along with busy ball fields and jungle gyms will come more kids running across the street and a plethora of yellow school buses on the highways. With this in mind, it's a great opportunity for drivers everywhere to brush up on a couple of back to school driving tips.



1- Double Check the Crosswalks Double and triple check those intersections for children walking to and from school. Making full stops at Stop signs

and red lights before turning right will give you the time you need to be completely sure the coast is clear.



2- School Zones
Have your foot covering the
brake pedal and your eyes
scanning the road when
entering a marked school
zone. School zones require

you to obey the 25 MPH or slower speed limit, regardless of the day of the week or time of day.



3- Yellow School Bus
There are special regulations
in place to ensure that School
buses get from their origin to
their destination safe and
sound. When a school bus

stops with its red brake lights flashing and/or its stop sign raised, you MUST stop from either direction until all the kids are safely across the street and the bus lights stop flashing. Do not tailgate a bus as they often make sudden stops. When a school bus is trying to merge back into traffic, you MUST give them the right of way.

#### DID YOU KNOW ??

The Delmar Fire Dept. was organized on January 17, 1922 with 17 citizens of the Town present at the meeting. At this time, the firefighting equipment consisted of two hose carriages and a fire engine. It was not considered adequate for the needs of the community. On May, 1922, an order was placed with the Buffalo Chemical Fire Extinguisher Co. for a Stewart Truck equipped with a 350 gallon Hale Pump. The Fire Department occupied a building on First Street between Grove and Jewel until 1925 when they moved into a building on State Street. In addition to fire- fighting, the local firemen serve in Civil Defense work, first aid instructions and fire prevention work.
