SPRING CLEAN-UP

For many years, the Town has set aside special days to provide its residents a town-wide clean-up day. This clean-up day was established to allow residents the opportunity to get rid of items above and beyond weekly household garbage such as items stored in the attic, garage or storage shed. In an effort to make this process as orderly as possible we have established guidelines if you opt to participate in the clean-up. (SEE BELOW) In addition to collecting items you wish to discard around your house, this may be a good time to network with neighbors to assess the condition of your neighborhood. Individual organizations, such as the Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, and Civic Groups may want to work with the Town to beautify our Parks. The Adopt a Street program is still active and it may be an opportunity for the organizations/residents that have adopted a street to encourage the residents that reside on the street to participate in the town wide clean up.

2020 Clean Up dates are as follows: <u>Delmar. Delaware -</u> Wed. & Thurs. April 15th & 16th <u>Delmar. Maryland</u> – Tues. & Wed. April 21st & April 22nd

Collection times will be between the hours of 7:30 a.m. & 3:00 p.m.



To participate in the Spring Clean Up, we are asking residents or civic organizations to contact Town Hall at 302-846-2664 or 410-896-2777 no later than the week prior to collection and provide the following:

- 1) Resident's name or the Organization's name
- 2) Your Address or the location along with contact phone number
- 3) Brief description of items to be picked up.

After this information is received the Administrative Office will follow-up with a reminder confirmation phone call that the resident or the organization has been added to the list to participate in the Spring Clean-Up Program. **This special clean-up collection is only available for our current weekly garbage service customers.** Items **NOT** eligible for collection:

Automobiles	Heavy Machinery
Oil, Gas Cans	Tires
Riding Lawn Mowers	Freezers, Refrigerators
Air Conditioners	Paint
Construction Materials	Sleep Sofas
Large Tree Stumps	Chemicals
Automotive Parts	Any item containing Freon

Limbs over 3 ft. and not bundled will not be removed. Window Frames will need to have the glass removed before it is picked up. Only one couch per household will be removed and one box spring and one mattress per household will be removed. Any other items deemed excessive by Public Works will NOT be removed.

Although there are two days scheduled per State, there will only be one pick up per location. You will **NOT** receive collection on both days.

Utility Bill Getting Higher?



This Means Your Usage Is Increasing.

In the past few quarters, the Delmar Utility Commission has seen many residents have high utility bills due to leaky toilets. Leaky toilets cause

hundreds to thousands of gallons of water to go to waste. Consequently, the fix to the toilet will cost significantly less than a high utility bill. Below you will see the five most common causes for a leaky toilet.

5 Most Common Causes of a Leaky Toilet

- **Faulty Flapper**
- **Problems with the Fill Valve** •
- **Refill Tube is Malfunctioning** •
- The Float Ball
- Worn Gasket

We suggest to place a few drops of food coloring in the tank of your toilet and wait a few minutes or up to 30 minutes. If the dyed water in the tank of your toilet shows up in the bowl of your toilet without flushing it, that indicates a flapper seal or flush valve that needs to be replaced. Below is a website to assist you if you wish to tackle this issue. If you haven't stopped vour toilet from continually running, consider calling a professional plumber to address the problem before you waste any more time and money.

Reminder

Delinquent utility bills accumulate an interest of 1% per month beginning the day after the due date. The due date is listed on all utility bills and is generally one month after the billing date. Other penalties for late payments include a \$10 Administrative Fee on the seventh day after the due date.

- Disconnection for non-payment can occur as early as sixteen days after the due date. A \$40 Disconnection Fee is added as of 8:00 A.M. on the day of the scheduled disconnection.
- If you are making an on-line payment, please allow 24 hours for payment to be notated on the account.
- If the bill is not satisfied and your • services are disconnected- Before water service can be restored the entire amount of the bill and a \$10 reconnection fee must be collected during regular business hours (8:00 a.m.-4:30 p.m.)
- Services can be restored after hours up to 6:00 p.m. and the reconnection fee is \$30. Payment must be rendered to Town Hall by 9:00 a.m. the following business morning or the evening of restoration. Payments can be deposited in our drop box located behind Town Hall.

Some Notes from Public Works



Fire Hydrant Flushing- The Public Works staff will be doing hydrant flushing

the week of March 16th. We suggest storing water in advance for this period and we apologize for any inconvenience. Low water pressure may occur during the flushing and discoloration may happen afterwards.

Community beautification should be high on our agenda as a local leader or a neighborhood or community organization. Simple projects range from planting some pretty flowers or

shrubs to painting planters, benches, sign posts, or whatever is beginning to look a little tired. Volunteer-led projects such as these are one of the quickest ways to inspire more community spirit, socializing and action. The Town of Delmar Public Works Department has started the beautification of the parks and the downtown area. We will be working with Delmar High School art department in creating a beautiful mural on the State Street Tot Lot fence and the local Cub Scouts will also be doing some beautification as well. Also, we will be working with the Delaware Forest Service and our local Community Development Coordinator to replace the trees in the West Tot Lot on the west side of Town to also make this an enjoyable park to visit by removing the gumball trees and replacing them with a friendlier tree.

A visually appealing community increases property values, attracts businesses and improves the Towns and neighborhoods image. Beauty is one of the three most influential factors in community attachment, which means loyalty to our Town. Some research even shows that a nice-looking neighborhood and parks promote good behavior.



CENSUS 2020 IMPORTANT DATES

March 12-20: Households will begin receiving official Census Bureau mail with detailed information on how to respond to the 2020 Census online, by phone or by mail.

March 30-April 1: The Census Bureau will <u>count people who are experiencing</u> <u>homelessness</u> over these three days. As part of this process, the Census Bureau

counts people in shelters, at soup kitchens and mobile food vans, on the streets and at non-sheltered, outdoor locations such as tent encampments.

April 1:<u>CENSUS DAY IS OBSERVED</u> <u>NATIONWIDE</u>. By this date, every home will receive an invitation to participate in the 2020 Census. Once the invitation arrives, you should respond for your home in one of three ways: online, by phone or by mail. When you respond to the census, you'll tell the Census Bureau where you live as of April 1, 2020.

April: Census takers will begin visiting college students who live on campus, people living in senior centers and others who live among large groups of people. Census takers also begin conducting quality check interviews to help ensure an accurate count.

May-July: Census takers will begin visiting homes that haven't responded to the 2020 Census to help make sure everyone is counted.

December: The Census Bureau will deliver appointment counts to the President and Congress as required by law.

Community Revitalization Projects DELMAR, MARYLAND SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL PROJECT STATUS UPDATE: This project to construct 2200 linear feet of ADA compliant sidewalk, curb and guttering on the eastside of S. Second St. from E. State St. to Delmar Elementary School is scheduled to begin March 9, 2020. Project construction will be performed a section of the street at a time, beginning at E. State St. moving south. Only the section of Second St. under construction at a given time will be blocked and closed to through traffic. Additional information will be made available on

Community Development Block Grants

The Office of Community Development, Delmar, Maryland has limited SFY18 CDBG grant funds available to assist eligible low-moderate income, Delmar, Maryland residents/ occupant/homeowners to repair subcode living conditions. The current grant will close in June 2020. Eligible projects must be approved and start in a timeframe that allows completion by the stated deadline. Interested candidates should contact William Hardin, **Community Development Coordinator** at 410-896-2777 ext. 103 or come to Delmar Town Hall to obtain program eligibility information and receive an application before March 31, 2020.

The Delmar Office of Community Development is also taking applications for the Delaware SFY21 CDBG Grant Program for submittal to Sussex County Department of Community Development and Housing (DCDH). DCDH will make an award announcement by July, 2021 should funds be allocated to Sussex County. Interested DE resident occupant/homeowners may inquire and obtain an application at Town Hall or by contacting this office. A waiting list of previous candidates currently exists. When funds are awarded to Sussex County DCHD, assistance will be provided to candidates on the waiting list in order of when the application was received.
